



Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

I have audited the financial report of The Bankstown Trotting Recreational Club Ltd T/A Club Condell Park, (the company) which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2023 and the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and the director's declaration.

In my opinion, the accompanying financial report of the company is in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, including:
